QUO VADIS DENDROARCHAEOLOGY?

From the first days of dendrochronology in the 1920ies onward, archaeology played a major role in the development of this field of research. But in the last decades the archaeological dendrochronology appears to have lost impetus and influence – while at the same time succeeding at its greatest achievements so far. However, dating alone has become a technical skill and is not sufficient any more to take part in today's research.

What are promising approaches in current dendroarchaeological research projects? And is the current situation linked to our understanding of interdisciplinarity?
